A wide range of resources can be traded on ASPIRE including:

- Organics like soil, plants, and grass can be exchanged.
- Paper, cardboard, and equipment are actively traded, promoting recycling and reuse.
- Metals, both ferrous and non-ferrous, are part of the extensive trading options.
- Plastics are traded for recycling and repurposing.
- Glass, including bottles and glassware, fosters sustainable practices.
- Textiles, such as fabrics and garments, promote circular economy principles.
- ASPIRE allows the trading of hazardous materials, ensuring safe disposal and reuse in a regulated environment.

- Chemicals for efficient utilization and responsible handling.
- Liquids, including oils, solvents, and fuels, for sustainable management.
- E-waste (electronic waste) for proper recycling and disposal.
- Construction and demolition materials like concrete, bricks, and rubble for efficient reuse and recycling.
- Furniture items for sustainable acquisition or disposal.
- Automotive tools and parts for efficient sourcing and selling.
- Wood and timber materials for responsible forestry practices and reuse.
