Are you using your purple glass recycling bin correctly?

As part of the Victorian Governments new four-bin recycling system, eligible residents across Frankston City have received a separate purple glass recycling bin. Glass bottles and jars now go into your new purple bin, lightly rinsed with lids off. Empty glass bottles and jars go in your purple bin loose, not in plastic bags. All other household glass goes into your general rubbish bin, including broken drinking glasses, windows, mirrors, vases, cooking dishes, and perfume bottles. Correctly using your glass recycling bin makes a big impact on Victoria's sustainable future.

Pet Desexing Voucher Scheme

All cats & dogs in the City of Frankston must be desexed and you must provide a copy of your desexing certificate when you register your pet with Council (Some exemptions apply).

Frankston City Council Offers a Pet Desexing Voucher Scheme to cover 1/3 of the cost of desexing cats & dogs for Frankston residents who hold a Pension Card, Healthcare Car or War Veterans Card.

Vouchers are non-transferable and must be used within 28 days of issue. When the animal is desexed, they must be registered with Frankston City Council within 7 days. Maximum 2 vouchers per household.

CFA Free Smoke Alarm Installation

Do you have a working smoke alarms in your home?

The Country Fire Authority (CFA) is offering to install free smoke alarms powered with a 10 year lithium battery in the homes of people who cannot purchase, install or maintain their alarms themselves.

Emergency Planning Advice Service

The Country Fire Authority (CFA) and the Australian Red Cross are delivering a free in-home visit service to residents of Frankston City in collaboration with Council.

Emergency Planning Advice Service (EPAS) is designed for people who need everyday support to remain in their homes. This includes people who are older, and/or people living with a disability or chronic medical condition. EPAS is a person-centred conversation that aims to develop an emergency plan specific to your individual needs.



Cost: Membership Fee is \$20 per year plus the entry fee to PARC—which is at a special rate for Fab 50 card holders.


This gives you full aquatic access to the lap pool , spa , sauna and steam room as well as the Aquatic Exercise class.




