One-off-funding is available to support community organisations with an **environmental and sustainability project** that support the strategic vision for Frankston City's future **and results in local positive community outcomes**

Frankston City Council aims to support eligible community groups that contribute to one or more Council priorities from either

<u>Greening our Future 2014-2024 Strategy</u>, key themes of the strategy are:

- 1. Protecting and enhancing natural assets
- 2. Wise use of natural resources
- 3. Minimising environmental impacts
- 4. Educating and engaging the community

Climate Change Strategy 2023-2030, key themes of the strategy are:

- 1. Invest in and support the uptake of active and zero emissions transport
- 2. Accelerate the transition to renewable energy and zero carbon buildings/assets
- 3. Protect and adapt our natural environment and open spaces
- 4. Build the community's capacity for climate action and resilience to the impacts of climate change
- 5. Advance the transition towards zero waste and a circular city

The project must also:

- Have a community education and engagement component
- Have a point of difference and is outside the scope of normal day-to-day operations

What projects can be funded? – This is not an exhaustive list

- Workshops that encourage waste diversion, composting, worm farming, water recycling, water efficient garden beds or bush food gardens
- Small events that connect people and increase their knowledge of the climate emergency and provide skills for effective advocacy and action such as a documentary screening
- Open day community events such as tree planting days or bush regeneration activities
- Workshops that provide information to the community around making their homes more energy efficient or to transition to 100% renewable electricity
- Community programs that encourage skills to expand sustainable behavior such as how to access the various rebates available, bicycle maintenance workshops or clothing exchange activities

Funding

Funding will be distributed to 6 successful recipients. There are two tiers of funding:

- Tier 1 (\$1,000 for 5 recipients) supports smaller environmental and sustainability projects
- Tier 2 (\$5,000 for 1 recipient) supports environmental and sustainability projects that aims for longer lasting change and greater community reach

The Environmental Sustainability Grants is a competitive process and limited to the amount of funds available. Applicants are not guaranteed funding, nor can an applicant be guaranteed full funding (refer to eligibility).

Eligibility

Community groups and organisations seeking to apply for funds must be:

- Not-for-profit community group or organisation
- Either be:
 - Incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 or commenced the process of incorporation (evidence will be required)
 - Endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient
 (DGR) as covered by Item 1 of the table in section 30.15 of the Income Tax Assessment 1997
 - Auspiced (sponsored or supported) by another incorporated or DGR covered Item 1 organisation that will accept legal and financial responsibility for the project or activity (evidence will be required)
- Proposing a project outcome that is:
 - Located within the geographical boundaries of Frankston City
 - For the general community without discrimination or restriction and are socially, economically and physically accessible to the community

Funding will not be considered for organisations, projects that:

- Do not meet the above stated eligibility criteria;
- Funding sought is for operational day-to-day activities;
- Receiving other Council funding for the project
- Are requesting funding for capital works and capital expenses including vehicles, air conditioning units, machinery or solar panels
- Requesting funding that would otherwise be covered by insurance;
- Involve activities that are the responsibility of another level of government (such as education, health); or are the responsibility of a group under their incorporation or lease/license agreement (including recurrent expenses and capital works);
- Seeking retrospective funding for projects already started or been completed;
- Support programs that create or may present hazards to the community;
- Support programs that do not reflect widely held community standards;
- Contravene State and Commonwealth legislation, Local Laws or Frankston Planning Scheme:
- Are an individual, commercial and/or profit making organisation, political party or hosting a political event;
- Are currently involved in a tendering or procurement process with the Council;
- Are in financial debt with Council or have not previously complied with grant conditions (including unable to properly account for prior funds; have not spent funds for the agreed purpose; or have not returned a detailed accountability form for previous years community grants);
- Are Staff, Councillor or contractor to Frankston City Council (any exemptions in unique circumstances would require approval from the Director Communities, and necessitate all Disclosure of Interest requirements are met);
- Are unable to provide required documents as per the application guidelines

Assessment Process

Eligible grant applications will be assessed in accordance with the criteria and weighting as outlined in each Council grant's application guidelines and assessed by the responsible person(s) outlined in the Community Grants Policy.

Recipients will be released on Council's website and Transparency Hub.

NOTE: Canvassing or lobbying of Councillors, employees of Frankston City Council or assessment panel members in relation to any grant, subsidy and sponsorship applications is prohibited.

Required Attachments

- Certificate of Incorporation or evidence of legislative provisions for charitable purposes
- Current Certificate of Currency Public Liability
 Insurance
- Minutes from your organisation's last Annual General Meeting or annual report
- Current financial statement
 (Income/Expenditure, balance sheet and cash flow)
- Auspice applicants must attach a letter of approval from the auspice organisation and auspicing organisation must provide the required documents
- Evidence of cost/s for any requested essential equipment (quotations / screenshots etc)
- If on public land, letter of support from relevant land owner

Child Safety

Everyone in the community has a responsibility in ensuring the health, safety and wellbeing of children.

- All grant recipients must, at minimum, commit to proactively keeping children safe and reporting any concerns of child safety.
- Grant recipients are required to comply with all relevant child safety legislation which may include, but is not limited to, <u>The Victorian Child</u> <u>Safe Standards</u> (2022) and The Child Wellbeing and Safety Act (2005). Council *may* request evidence of compliance.
