Temporary changes to Traffic conditions and Pedestrian access

Construction of the new \$22 million multilevel Kananook Commuter Car Park next to the Frankston Basketball Stadium is progressing well, with the ground foundations nearing completion.

The next phase of works involves installing precast concrete wall panels.

To safely accommodate these works, some temporary changes to Traffic conditions and Pedestrian access are required between 7 AM to 6 PM from Wednesday 6 December until Friday 15 December 2023.

During this time:

- The overflow car park between the basketball stadium and Kananook Reserve will be closed.
- The gravel road from McCulloch Avenue into the reserve will be closed.
- Vehicle access to Easton Avenue (as marked on the map) will only be available to properties in the street
- Parking will not be available along Easton Avenue
- There will be additional construction traffic and noise in the area during work hours (7am-5pm weekdays).
- Works hours may be extended to Saturday 16 December (weather dependent)

Traffic Management will be in place during this time. For your safety and the safety of staff, please follow all directions and signage. We also recommend allowing extra time for travel and to find parking in the area.

The Kananook Commuter Car Park is funded by the Australian Government through the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications, and the Arts and is constructed on Council owned land. The project is due for completion in mid-2024 and will provide 300-plus spaces for public transport commuters, and additional parking for nearby recreation users during off-peak hours.
