Overview

16 Days of Activism (16DoA) is an annual United Nations campaign to challenge violence against women and girls. Between *Friday 22nd November* and *Sunday 8th of December* Council encouraged sporting clubs to raise awareness by hosting a dedicated 'Respect Round' in support of the campaign.



A club information pack, including resources to support clubs in the lead up and on the day was sent those registered and expressed interest.

Clubs were encouraged to:

- wear orange in support of the Campaign
- have players wear an Orange Tape (on the arms or on their uniform)
- promote posters and flyers around club rooms, toilet facilities and on social media
- share supportive resources
- read a short blurb before any main matches or training to help raise awareness of the campaign and
- work through the Frankston Gender Inclusive Club Toolkit as an ongoing method to work on equality and respect
