

Audience All Students 60a Playne Street FRANKSTON This program aims to assist young people with the transition from Primary to Secondary school through exploration of strengths, support people and opportunities available to them throughout their high school experience. The importance of seeking support and the idea of Year 7 as a time for exploration and discovery are discussed. This program can be tailored to your school's specific needs.

The 'WHAT Program' aims to empower students by exploring various topics and opportunities, connecting them to community, and raising awareness of local programs, events, and support services that allow them to pursue their passions and aspirations, while providing ongoing support in response to current challenges and needs. This is done through engaging and interactive workshops, with the ability to tailor sessions to the specific student needs identified by the school and their young people. This targeted approach will ensure sessions are purposeful, relevant, and engaging regardless of year level and specific cohort needs.

The 'What Bus' is used for youth outreach within all Frankston LGAs and can also be hired out for outreach opportunities that align with Frankston Youth Services' core purpose in providing support and engagement for young people within the Frankston Municipality.

Hire The 'What Bus' for events, school or community wellbeing days, open days, sports days, festivals, youth/ student recognition events and more.

An engaging and interactive information session offering an overview of the programs, supports and events offered by Frankston Youth Service. typically delivered in 5 - 10 mins to a large audience such as school assembly

Youth Central welcomes school visits Monday to Friday! We offer an engaging introduction to our space and support services for secondary school students. Visits typically last 2 hours and include fun activities like badge making, crafts, gaming, and pool, plus the option of a sausage sizzle.
